SUPERB LOCATION

Farringtons occupies 25 acres of parkland in picturesque Kent, and yet is only 12 miles from central London. Chislehurst is 5 minutes from the M25, 45 minutes from Gatwick Airport, 1 hour from Heathrow International Airport, and 25 minutes by train from Charing Cross and Waterloo stations.

Whilst conveniently close to Central London and all of its attractions Farringtons remains a remarkably calm, safe campus. The School lies behind CCTV monitored security gates and is surrounded by sports fields, recreational space and woodland; we have our own Forest School. We are also fortunate to be located in Chislehurst, a leafy, welcoming area with a real English village feel.

Boarding & Pastoral Care

At Farringtons, we provide happy, warm and friendly surroundings for our boarders, and different living areas for each age group. We create a homely and secure living environment in which students feel safe, confident and cared for, whatever their age.

There are many clubs and activities arranged for boarders during the week and at weekends. These include regular sporting fixtures and supervised outings to the theatre, cinema, ice rink, shopping centre, museums, roller-skating rink, waxworks and local places of interest, as well as to London, which remains a firm favourite.

Academic

With most pupils proceeding to higher education, academic standards are high. Each pupil is encouraged to strive to reach their full potential.

Our academic success is due to small classes, dedicated staff and supportive teaching, that ensures each pupil receives the individual attention they need. Academic achievement, as well as the holistic development of the individual, are of prime importance at Farringtons. Many of our Sixth Form students secure places at Russell Group Universities and study a wide range of degree courses including Medicine, Law and Engineering.

EAL FEES

English as an Additional Language (EAL) for Pupils in Years 7-13

At Farringtons, we focus very much on the needs of the individual. On arrival, overseas pupils will be tested individually and placed in a small teaching group according to their level of English skills.

Pupils are taught by well-qualified and experienced teachers and depending on their progress they may be prepared for the Cambridge Preliminary English Test (PET) and First Certificate in English (FCE). We are also proud of the GCSE results in English and English Literature achieved by our overseas pupils. Pupils can also take the IGCSE in English.

If pupils arrive in Year 12, post 16 years old, with a good standard of English, they receive intensive tuition for their IELTS (International English Language Testing System) examination. IELTS is recognised by universities and employers in many countries as the highest international standard of language assessment. Pupils who wish to go to study at university must gain a Level 6 minimum as an average across the four skills areas of listening, reading, writing and speaking.

All pupils receive at least one lesson of EAL teaching per week at no additional charge. In addition, pupils may have the opportunity to sit the English Speaking Board (ESB) examinations which offer valuable experience and practice of presentation and public speaking skills.

Fees include tuition, all food and refreshments, laundry, evening and weekend activities and English Language support

Payment of Fees

Parents should note that fees are payable in advance, on or before the first day of each term. Parents may pay by direct debit over nine months; information available from the Bursar's Department.

Fee Reductions

While two (or more) siblings are at the School, a reduction of 10% is made to the fees of the younger sibling(s).

Registration Fee

£100.00 (non-refundable)

Acceptance Deposit

For overseas day and boarding pupils, deposit of £6015.00 is required. Deposits are payable when parents accept an offer of a place in school.

The Acceptance Deposit will be retained in the general funds of the School until the Pupil leaves and will be repaid by means of a credit without interest to the final payment of Fees or other sums due to the School on leaving, unless stated otherwise in our Terms and Conditions.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where do your boarders come from?

Our local boarders tend to come from South East and Central London, whilst other UK boarders may have families living and working overseas. Our international boarders currently come from Spain, France, China, Hong Kong, Kenya, Ukraine, Nigeria, Poland and Sierra Leone.

Can I call home when I want to?

Yes! You can call home whenever you want, as long as it is not during lessons, prep, mealtimes, or after lights-out. Mobile phones are allowed, but should be used without disturbing others and may not be used during the school day or after lights out.

Do I have to do prep/homework?

Definitely. There is Study every weekday from 5pm

until 6pm and after Dinner if necessary. Prep is done in studies under quiet conditions with no talking allowed, although you can ask permission to work with a classmate on shared projects..

What happens if I feel ill in the middle of the night?

Please tell your House Mistress/House Master or one of the Tutors if you feel ill in the night. At home you'd wake mum or dad – here you wake your House Mistress/House Master or one of the Tutors. There will always be somebody to look after you.

Are we allowed to suggest new ideas for boarding?

You can do that at any time to the staff member on duty, but if you want to suggest new ideas to lots of people at the same time, ask if it can be discussed at a House meeting. Sometimes there is a good reason for not changing things, but sometimes suggestions from pupils are very useful in helping to improve the way boarding runs. Suggestions are checked daily and issues raised in them are dealt with promptly. There are also several committees, representing all year groups in the house, which meet regularly to discuss various matters of significance to boarders. There are termly surveys where you can suggest ideas too.

Who is responsible for looking after me?

South House and West House are run by a team of boarding staff who share responsibility for the care, discipline and general atmosphere of the boarding houses, getting to know everyone well, ensuring that they are there to give plenty of support and guidance and being in regular contact with parents.

How often can I see my family and friends?

They can come to see you any time after school and at weekends and you can go out with them by arrangement with the boarding staff. Boarders may go away for weekends or part of the weekend, provided the school has received an invitation from the host concerned and the consent of your parent/guardian together with the permission of your House Mistress/House Master.

Who can boarders speak to if they need help?

Boarding staff are all experienced in how to listen to and deal with specific pastoral issues related to boarders and are always readily available to them. Supporting the work done by the boarding staff, the School Nurses regularly welcome boarders who chat to them about a variety of issues. The School also has a qualified School Counsellor, whose services are offered free to any boarder who may wish to talk to her and boarders also have free access to various national helplines. School prefects are always available too. No matter what the problem, Boarders can talk to any member of Farringtons staff or any of the Sixth Form prefects.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Is there support for boarders whose first language is not English?

We have a specialised department to help pupils whose first language is not English. Our EAL (English as an Additional Language) department offers support both to small groups and on a one-to-one basis if needed.

Does the School offer support for boarders with specific learning needs?

Farringtons has a dedicated Learning Needs Department which helps pupils who have certain learning needs. This usually takes the form of one-to-one lessons with a trained professional.

How safe is the Farringtons community?


Although Farringtons is situated just 10 miles from Central London we pride ourselves on providing a very safe environment for all our pupils - their safety and wellbeing are our top priority

and our security is excellent. Farringtons staff have advanced child protection training, fire safety training, first aid training and health and safety training which is updated annually.

The school gates are code entry only. In addition, each Boarding House is protected electronically and entry is by a proximity card system. Each pupil is given the code which will give access to the pupil entrance to the House between certain hours.

Does Farringtons have Exeats?

Farringtons does not have exeats so boarders from overseas do not have to leave School to stay with guardians apart from during main holidays and half-terms.
