
Boston Trinity Academy is an independent Christian, co-ed college preparatory middle and high school educating students in grades 6 -12.


Boston Trinity Academy provides students in the 9th-12 grades with a **well-rounded college preparatory education grounded in the liberal arts tradition.**

From the 9th-grade Humanities class to the 12th-grade **Senior Symposium** project, Upper School students learn to transform their questions into real contributions of their own. Doing so, they discover a vision for their lives.

Students in the 11th and 12th grades participate in the **comprehensive college counseling program.** We expect all our students to attend four-year colleges, and we prepare them for success when they get there. Students must complete at least three of the thirteen **AP (Advanced Placement) courses** and a year-long research and writing course to graduate.

Senior Symposium is a collegiate-level seminar. Seniors spend the year exploring issues of social relevance through two lenses: moral philosophy and Christian ethics. This results in a 20-25 page research paper, which they present and defend before a panel of invited judges. No course better prepares students for the rigors of college-level research.

The Arts

All our students explore the creative process and gain new perspectives on the complexity and beauty of the human experience. They gain the tools to express themselves in new ways. How? The visual and performing arts are required parts of the curriculum.

Each year, theatre productions engage students either on stage or behind the scenes. The entire community enjoys and celebrates this creativity expressed through art shows, concerts, and performances.

Despite the challenges of the 2020-21 school year, the Chamber Music Ensemble delights us during weekly chapel services and important events. Selected ensemble participants receive an hour of coaching each week.



Athletics

Boston Trinity Academy fields 18 athletic teams in 8 sports at the Varsity, JV, and Middle School level. Varsity sports compete in the Massachusetts Bay Independent League (MBIL) and the Independent Girls League (GIL). The Boston Trinity Lions play with grit and passion. The result: over 28 championships and tournament trophies in multiple sports, won by players who are an example to others.

Our faculty coaches work with students to practice and improve their soccer, lacrosse, softball, baseball, and cross country skills.

8 sports, 18 teams, 28 championships:

Building a Legacy



