**At Pitt, making the college experience accessible for all students is a top priority.** As you and your family explore college options, the Office of Admissions and Financial Aid is here to help you through understanding your financial options. The value of a Pitt education goes beyond financial considerations; it's about investing your intellect and character to fully embrace the lifelong rewards it offers.

## International Scholarships

The University of Pittsburgh offers a limited number of merit-based scholarships ranging from \$5,000 to \$10,000 USD per year for international first-year students. These scholarships are renewable for four years, provided the recipient maintains satisfactory academic progress and meets all other award conditions. Complete your application by February 1 to be automatically considered for this scholarship—no separate application is needed. Admitted students can also explore additional opportunities through Pitt's scholarship database, PittFund\$Me.

## Applying to Pitt

In order to apply to the University of Pittsburgh, make sure you fulfill these requirements!

- Complete your application by April 1 for the fall term or October 1 for the spring term.
- Fill out the online application at [admissions.pitt.edu](https://admissions.pitt.edu) or using the Common App.
- Submit your response to the short answer question or the Common App essay.
- Submit an official high school transcript equivalent to U.S. grades 9-12, or enter your high school academic information using the Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR). The SRAR is not required for international applicants.
- SAT or ACT results (Test optional through Fall 2025).
- Official TOEFL, IELTS, or Duolingo scores.
- Record of any university credits taken.
- \$55 application fee (USD)
